Helen Fuller: Bowerbird

Pat Hoffie: This Mess We're In

This Mess We're In explores the chaos and catastrophes that have become white noise in our everyday lives. Through a visual anthology of failures, propositions and imagined futures, Brisbanebased artist Pat Hoffie presents us with a series of mise en scènes where the borderlines between the factual and the fantastic disintegrate. Across three distinct bodies of work, the artist chronicles her observations of disasters that are both personal and more broadly socio-political. More

Decades: 80 Years of Collecting

Decades is a compilation of well-known and rarely seen works by significant Australian and international artists, including paintings, sculpture, ceramics and works on paper. A small sample of more than 3000 art objects acquired by QUT since 1945, the exhibition reveals hidden patterns and unexpected connections.

As Above, So Below Part of ISEA

23 June – 13 October QUT Art Museum

The term 'as above, so below' is commonly used to describe the idea that the microcosm mirrors the macrocosm and vice versa. In our current state of climate crisis, whereby seemingly minute changes in temperature and sea levels threaten catastrophic changes to the broader ecosystem, 'as above, so below' becomes a warning. This exhibition brings together new and recent works by Australian and international artists who engage with our environment by investigating hidden ecosystems, plant communication, endangered species, air quality, eco-acoustics, posthumanism, plant/human relationships, and more. More

William Robinson: The Painter & the Printmaker

Until 8 September 2024 William Robinson Gallery

This exhibition provides rare insight into Robinson's mastery as a colourist and mark-maker by showcasing four decades of printmaking, in particular his lithographs and etchings, alongside major paintings. From his early intaglio prints to the virtuosic landscape lithographs Robinson's prints span a diverse range of styles and subject matter. More

Leah King-Smith: rhythm wRites

27 October 2024 – 9 March 2025 QUT Art Museum

Leah King-Smith will collaborate with leading First Nations creative industry experts from visual art, music, dance, theatre, and creative writing to orchestrate a major exhibition. The project, rooted in a decolonisation framework, explores simultaneity, interconnectivity, rhythm, ethereality, spatiality, sound, visuality, and interactivity. Stories of First Nations experiences, histories, and intergenerational connectivity will weave through six galleries in an immersive installation facilitated by QUT's Visualisation and Interactive Solutions for Engagement and Research (VISER) group.

William Robinson: Numinous

1 October 2024 – September 2025 William Robinson Gallery

This exhibition will focus on William Robinson's spritual connection to the landscape, bringing together major paintings as well as works on paper. It will draw largely on works from the QUT Art Collection, including several works from Robinson's acclaimed *Creation* series.
